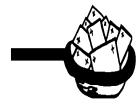

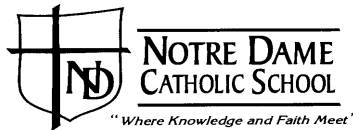

Policy for Celebrating a Quinceañera

Any child wishing to celebrate a Quinceañera must...

1. call the Pastoral Center eighteen (18) months in advance to set an interview and date for the Quinceañera; this date is tentative upon meeting the following requirements:
2. be enrolled and regularly attending religious education classes or attend Catholic school two (2) consecutive years prior to the Quinceañera.
3. have received the sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, and Eucharist.
4. family be registered and active members of a Catholic Parish.
5. attend four (4) preparation sessions prior to the Quinceañera.

In addition, parents of the Quinceañera must be actively involved in the preparation sessions with their child.

4. sea la familia registrada y activa de una Parroquia Católica.
5. asista cuatro (4) sesiones de la preparación antes de la Quinceañera.

Además, los padres de la Quinceañera serán implicados activamente en la sesiones de la preparación con su niña(o).
