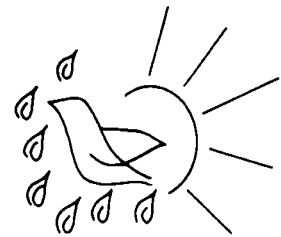

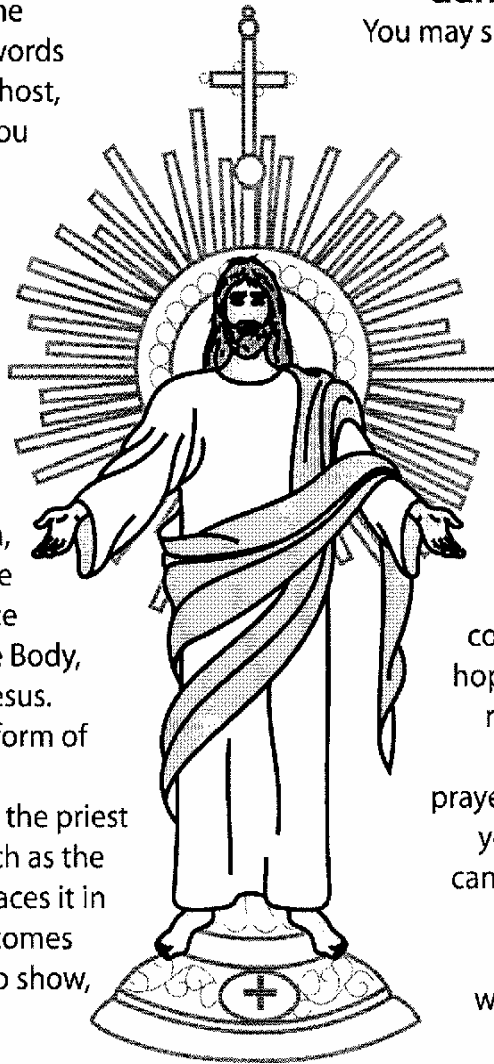

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

Catholics believe that during the Mass which we attend each week (for some of us daily), the priest (during the consecration) speaks these words as he holds the communion host, "...He took bread and gave you thanks. He broke the bread, gave it to his disciples and said: Take this all of you, and eat it: this is my body which will be given up for you." When the priest says "this is my body", it is at that instant when, through the miracle of transubstantiation, the bread and wine which we offer as the bloodless sacrifice to our Lord truly become the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus. It is His true Presence in the form of bread and wine. **It is Christ.** Perpetual Adoration is when the priest takes a consecrated host, such as the one described above, and places it in a monstrance. (monstrance comes from the Latin "monstrare" to show, to expose to view.)



What do you actually do during adoration?

You may sign up to be an "adorer" which allows you to schedule yourself for one or more hours per week to pray before the very presence of Our Lord, exposed in the monstrance. It means that you can have some time alone with Jesus to recite your favorite prayers, read the bible, contemplate acts of faith, hope, charity, thanksgiving, reparation, pray a rosary or do whatever type of prayerful devotion that suits you before Our Lord. You can just sit and say nothing simply keeping Him company, just as you would with a dear friend.

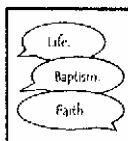

Parent Questions

At the start of a baptism, parents hear two questions. The first is, "What name do you give your child?" The answer is a no-brainer; by this time family and friends knows the sex, height, weight, and name of the baby. Still, naming the baby in the church is a formal act of presentation. This is the name by which the child will be known and called, even with the very words of baptism. The answer to this first question is easy, but speaking the child's name is profound.

The second question is deceptively simple. "What do you ask of God's Church for N.?" Many parents give the obvious answer, the one the rite offers as the first choice: "Baptism." It's correct. And profound. But parents may give another answer, and the rite suggests these: "faith," "the grace of Christ," "entrance into the Church," or "eternal life."

These options make this question provocative. Just what do these parents want? What do they want of the church gathered here? If the baptism takes place during Sunday Mass, the parents have an opportunity to speak their preference to the church gathered before them. Imagine the priest or deacon asking the question this way: "What do you parents ask everyone else gathered here to do for your child?"

Imagine the answers. "Set an example of prayer and service." "Teach my child by your words and actions what it means to love Christ." "Be there for my child when I need someone to help."

The first question is easy to answer. But the second deserves some preparation. Before coming to the church that day, parents should prepare a good answer to a good question: "What do you ask of God's Church for your child?"

Centering Prayer is a method designed to facilitate this development by preparing us to cooperate with the gift. It is not meant to replace other forms of prayer; it simply puts other kinds of prayer in a new and fuller perspective. Come and see.

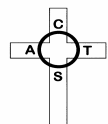

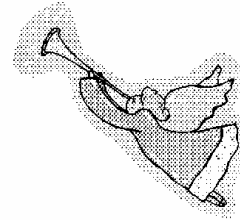
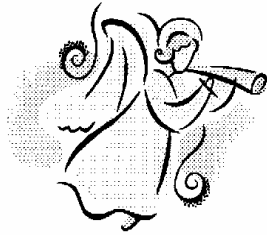

Through the Year with Fulton Sheen: Inspirational Selections for Each Day of the Year (242). When I was a child, I spent numerous Sunday evenings watching Bishop Sheen. I wasn't a Catholic then, but I was searching for God (although I didn't know it) and Sheen was so dramatic. He could tell a good story, humorous or otherwise. The author of more than 70 books, he died in 1979 at the age of 84. He wrote and spoke with such eloquence and insight that even today one feels that the experience of Sheen's reflections on love, holiness, spiritual power and what it means to be a Catholic remains the same. *I Love Lucy* was on in that same time slot, but when I wanted to know if life was worth living--and both my parents were away--I turned to the man in the crimson outfit and sonorous voice.

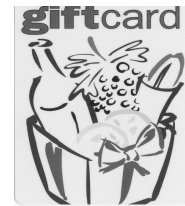

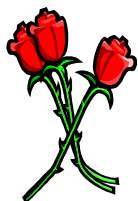
