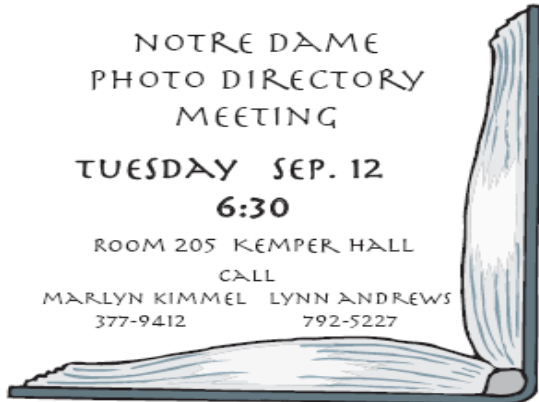
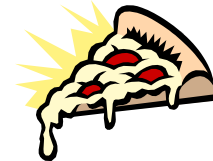

1998 Catholic bishops Conference
An excerpt from Everyday Christianity:
To Hunger & Thirst Justice

Workers are called to pursue justice.

As Catholics, we are called to pursue justice in our everyday life. In the Catholic tradition, work is not a burden, not just how we make a living. Work is a way of supporting our family, realizing our dignity, promoting the common good and participating in God's creation. This means often doing the ordinary well, making the most of our talents and opportunities, treating others fairly and with dignity, and working with integrity and creativity. Believers should be encouraged to choose their work based on how they can best use the gifts God has given them. Decisions made at work can make important contributions to an ethic of justice. Catholics have the often difficult responsibility of choosing between competing values in the workplace. This is a measure of holiness. Associations that enable workers, owners, or managers to pursue justice often make the witness of the individual more effective.

Required Training

All EMHC’s and anyone wanting to join this ministry are asked to attend an “Hour of Reflection” on Sunday, September 24th beginning at 2:00pm in the Fireplace Room.

After the “Hour of Reflection”, we will conduct a technical training for all new or prospective EMHC’s. The technical training will begin at approximately 3:30pm in the Church and last until 5:00pm.

Extraordinary

What does the term “extraordinary” mean as it is used in this ministry?

It does not mean that EMHC’s are necessarily “amazing”, “remarkable”, “astonishing”, “gifted” or “exceptional” members of our parish community although, some may very well be. What “extraordinary” means in this context is literally one who is *extra* to the *ordinary* minister of Holy Communion; the ordinary minister being a bishop, priest or deacon. So, while we should all strive to be “remarkable”, as EMHC’s we are only there to help those who ordinarily serve the Eucharist.

Qualifications

We are often asked what are the qualifications for becoming an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion here at Notre Dame. While we extend an open invitation to all members of our parish, EMHC’s are ultimately subject to the invitation and approval of our Pastor. Qualifications for this ministry both to invitation and ongoing participation are as follows:

You must believe and profess all that the holy Catholic Church teaches and proclaims to be revealed by God.

You must be recognized as a practicing Catholic committed to growth in faith, holiness and love of the Holy Eucharist and the holy Catholic Church.

You must be fully initiated into the holy Catholic Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist and Confirmation.

You must be steady of hand and foot. Difficulties with balance, eyesight and steadiness may require individuals to disqualify themselves from service in this ministry.

You must be recognized as being dependable and possessing sound judgment.

You must participate in all mandatory trainings and submit to a background check.

Participation

We invite you to a deeper relationship with Christ through this ministry. You will serve only once every 3 to 5 weeks depending on the mass time you choose. You will also have the opportunity to serve at holy day and weekday masses as well as funerals on a volunteer basis.

We try to honor each EMHC’s request for a particular mass time. But, in the end, please remember that this is a “ministry” and as such, we ask all EMHC’s to place the needs of the community ahead of their own and serve where needed.
