SURPRISE

Life is full of surprises, some pleasant, some not. The Scriptures are filled with stories of God's surprises cropping up where least expected: younger children obtaining the inheritance; the lowliest being seated up highest; an itinerant preacher, killed like a criminal, exalted to eternal, heavenly glory.

Anybody who has planned a wedding or similar event knows that they are filled with opportunities for surprises. For that bridegroom (who, in the Gospel story, has no direct contact with Jesus) the pleasant surprise came because somebody else had paid attention and had faith in Jesus.

We may think that the point of today's familiar story of the wedding at Cana is that when we have faith in Jesus, our lives will be pleasantly changed. A Christian, however, needs to have a broader perspective, and realize that to have faith in Christ means that somebody's life—maybe our own, maybe somebody else's—will be surprised for the better. © Copy-right, J. Sin embargo, un cristiano necesita tener una perspectiva más amplia, y darse cuenta que tener fe en Cristo implica que la vida de alguien—sea la tuya, sea la de otra persona—va a mejorarse sorpresivamente.

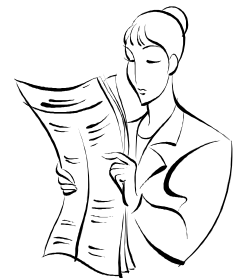

Quinceañera Celebrations

Requisitos para celebrar una Quinceañera en la Iglesia de Notre Dame:

1. Llame al Centro Pastoral 12 a 18 meses antes de la celebración para tener una entrevista y para poner la fecha de la Quinceañera. Esta fecha será tentativa, dependiendo de que cumpla los siguientes requisitos:
2. Estar inscrita y asistir regularmente a las clases de Educación Religiosa o asistir a una escuela Católica por un tiempo mínimo de dos (2) años consecutivos antes de la celebración de Quinceañera.
3. Debe haber recibido los Sacramentos del Bautismo, Reconciliación y Eucaristía.
4. La familia debe estar registrada y ser miembros activos de una Parroquia Católica.
5. Debe asistir a dos (2) sesiones de preparación antes de la celebración de Quinceañera. Por favor llamen la semana antes de las sesiones que van a asistir para estar preparados debidamente.

Además, los padres de la Quinceañera deben tomar parte activa de esta preparación.

Policy for Celebrating a Quinceañera at Notre Dame Catholic Church:

1. Call the Pastoral Center 12 to 18 months in advance to set an interview and date for the Quinceañera; this date is tentative upon meeting the following requirement.
2. Be enrolled and regularly attending Religious Education classes or attend Catholic School for two (2) consecutive years prior to the Quinceañera.
3. Have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation and First Eucharist.
4. Family be registered and be active members of a Catholic Parish.
5. Attend two (2) preparation sessions prior to the Quinceañera. Please call us the week before the sessions you plan to attend so we can prepare appropriately.
6. In addition, parents of the Quinceañera must be actively involved in the preparation sessions with their daughter.

The following is a list of sessions for 2007:

Monday, February 5 & Monday, February 12, 2007 (Team I)
Monday, May 7 & Monday, May 14, 2007 (Team II)
Monday, August 6 & Monday, August 13, 2007 (Team III)

Reconciliation

Our Catholic church treasures the sacrament of reconciliation. Many parishes offer a communal celebration of penance, especially during Advent and Lent. But private reconciliation is usually available every week of the year.

If you'd like to celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation, here's what to do:

Prepare. Prayerfully recall your sins. Some will be specific actions. Some represent a more general pattern of behavior.

Go to the priest. Visit when he's in the reconciliation room at your parish or ask for an appointment. You may either kneel anonymously behind a screen or sit in a chair where you may speak face to face.

Be welcome. You and the priest may greet each other. Make the Sign of the Cross. He may urge you to have confidence in God. You may indicate the interval since your last confession or anything else that will help. Just use common sense. Either you or the priest may read from Scripture.

Confess your sins. Some penitents begin with a formula like, "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned." But you don't have to. Let the priest know your sins. You may discuss the sins you confess so the priest can give you the best counsel.

Receive a penance. The priest will recommend some action after you leave to indicate to God the sincerity in your heart. Usually he suggests prayer or self-denial. If it sounds difficult, let him know.

Pray for forgiveness. The priest may invite you to say a prayer of sorrow aloud. If you remember the Act of Contrition, you may use it. But you may also speak simply from your heart.

Receive absolution. This is the best part. The priest proclaims absolution, and God forgives your sins.

Conclude. The priest may say, "Give thanks to the Lord for he is good." If so, answer, "His mercy endures forever." Or he may conclude informally.

Change! Go forth, and with God's help, begin to live a new life of freedom from the slavery of sin!

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The Code of Canon Law states that: "Individual and integral confession and absolution constitute the only ordinary means by which a member of the faithful conscious of grave sin is reconciled with God and the Church. Only physical or moral impossibility excuses from confession of this type; in such a case reconciliation can be obtained by other means" (Can. 960)

The USCCB website offers us the following explanation about the three different forms of administration of the Sacrament of Penance (www.usccb.org/liturgy/penance.shtml)

- A. The Rite of Reconciliation of Individual Penitents—"The first (form) is the reconciliation of an individual...with a new emphasis on the demand for personal dispositions and on the relationship to the word of God..."
- B. The Rite of Reconciliation of Several Penitents—"The second way of reconciliation is that of a communal preparation followed by individual confession and absolution..."
- C. The Rite of Reconciliation of Several Penitents with General Absolution—"Then there is the third way, a collective form of reconciliation with a single, general absolution. This form, however, is by way of exception, of necessity, in cases sanctioned by the bishops, and with the continuing obligation of individuals (confession) of grave sins, that is, mortal sins, at a later time." (Pope Paul VI, General Audience (April 3, 1974)).
