THANKSGIVING

The word “thanksgiving” most often calls to our mind the holiday in November. But as early as the middle of the second century Justin Martyr referred to the blessed bread and wine of the Lord’s Supper as “food we call ‘thanksgiving’ ” (in Greek *eucharistia*). The Thanksgiving we celebrate in the autumn is at times marked by a sort of proud societal self-congratulation and the consumption of food until we sink into an inert stupor. The “thanksgiving” that we call our Eucharist is just the opposite: we are led to it by an acknowledgment of our own failings; we remember our humble place in the scheme of things by giving praise to God alone.

While the food of Christ’s body and blood fills our spiritual hungers, it also creates in us a greater hunger. We are not sent to our spiritual sofas to let the Lord’s Supper settle; we are sent to be living signs of that thanksgiving for the world by looking out for the poor and powerless, feeding the hungry, caring for the sick, speaking out against the self-righteous. In short, the hunger created by our doing in remembrance of Christ must lead us to living in remembrance of him.

En fin, el hambre producida en nosotros al hacer el Memorial de Jesús nos tiene que impulsar a vivir “en memoria de él”.

Congratulations and God's blessings to all Dads in our parish and those visiting in Kerr County. May all of you be honored on this day.

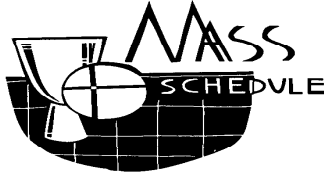

US National Cursillo New Seat for World Cursillo

On January 28, 2006, Bishop James A. Tamayo, Episcopal Advisor for the U. S. National Cursillo Movement attended a ceremony to transfer the World Organization of the Cursillo Movement (*Organismo Mundial de Cursillo de Creisinadad* OMCC) seat from the National Secretariat of Brazil to the National Secretariat of the United States. The church was filled with Cursillistas from various language groups to witness this transfer of responsibilities to the United States. As Episcopal Advisor for the National Secretariat, Bishop Tamayo received documents which symbolically transferred the seat from Brazil to the United States Executive Committee of OMCC for the next four years.

For the United States, it is a privilege and a great honor, to receive the World Organization of the Cursillo Movement, the OMCC, and the opportunity to coordinate this World Organization. This privilege and honor, implies the responsibility to coordinate, during the next four years, the four International groups that form the OMCC; The GET (The European Working Group - now in Spain), The APG (Asian Pacific Working Group - now in Taiwan), The GLCC (The Latin American Working Group - now in Colombia), and the NACG (The North American and Caribbean Working Group - now in Canada.)

The coordination includes, watching over and maintaining, the fidelity to the Statute of the OMCC, and the authenticity of the Foundational Charism that the

Holy Spirit deposited on the person of Eduardo Bonnín, and those young people from Catholic Action that assisted him, like Ferragut, Font, Rullan, Moncada y Riutort and with the spiritual guidance of clergy like Bishop Hervas and Frs. Juan Julia, Juan Capó, Sebastian Gaya, Cesario Gil and many others.

Speaking for the Executive Committee, Mr. Juan Ruiz spoke humbly in requesting the prayers and cooperation of every Cursillista in the United States so that the members of the Executive Committee of the OMCC could faithfully follow the inspiration of the Holy Spirit and fulfill their duties with genuine concern and dedication for the Cursillo Movement worldwide.

The OMCC seated in the United States provides an exceptional opportunity for Cursillistas in the United States, especially members of the National Secretariat, to show our unity and solidarity in providing a supportive hand to the OMCC Executive Committee as they work to achieve the tasks entrusted to them. Theirs is a very important and difficult task, but not an impossible one when the Cursillistas in the United States work together for the betterment of the Cursillo Movement in the United States and worldwide.

In this spirit of unity and support, Bishop Tamayo reminds us "We give positive witness to the meaning of *"Christ is Counting on You and I in Him."*
