“I AM”

Kindness and mercy are what the enslaved people of Israel needed, and they came in the form of deliverance. They came through a leader, Moses, who was once plucked from the Nile River and was now herding his father-in-law’s sheep in the land of Goshen. The bush that burned but was not consumed shows us that God is inexhaustible mystery.

Moses’ awe and deference are mixed with a touching conversational tone as he seeks to learn God’s name. And God sweetly responds. The somewhat abstract “I AM” distinguishes the God of Abraham and Isaac and Jacob from the minor gods in the territory who “are not.” They are helpless, powerless, and useless. Moses is to step out into an amazing future, and God will be there with outstretched arm. Just go and see, God seems to say.

FROM THE PASTOR

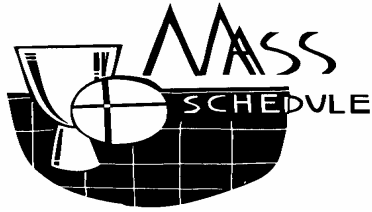
**LENTEN GREETINGS IN THE LORD!

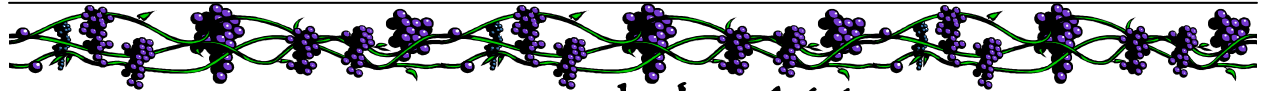

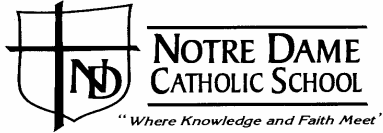

"THE MASS"

Introductory Rites

At the Last Supper, the Lord spoke to his disciples, took bread and wine, gave thanks to God, his Father, broke the bread, and gave to his followers gathered at table, the bread of life and the cup of eternal salvation. At Mass, we celebrate the presence of Christ **TODAY**. We use the same sequence of actions as Jesus did at the Last Supper: speaking, taking bread, giving thanks, breaking, sharing – and our celebration takes the shape of a meal, a banquet.

At each Mass, we gather as community, each of us with proper roles, and through rituals, symbols, gestures and postures, we remember, we give thanks, we praise, we worship, we petition. It is the celebration that makes us whole, and challenges us to go forth from this place changed, transformed, because of what we have just experienced.

And so, we want to always be aware of what we do and say in Mass. We hope that these next few weeks of commentaries help us to come to a better understanding of the rituals, symbols and gestures of liturgy.

The Mass contains 4 parts: the Introductory Rites, the Liturgy of the Word, the Liturgy of the Eucharist, and the Concluding Rite.

Today, we will cover the Introductory Rites.

In the action of singing together, we are gathered as the people of God assembled in His name. It is NOT a song to greet Father or to accompany the procession to the altar. After the procession reaches the altar, the priest and deacon kiss it. The altar is the center of thanksgiving and the point around which the other rites are in some manner arranged. It is the banquet table.

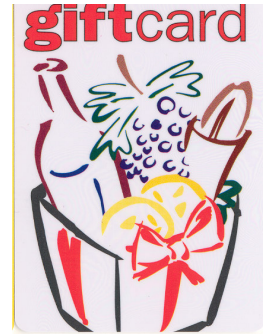
The presider always begins the celebration of the Mass with the Sign of the Cross, uniting us in the sign of our salvation, the sign of the Trinity, the sign of our faith. He then greets us.

At the penitential rite, we remember our sins and express praise and gratitude to God for his loving mercy. The Glory to God is a song of praise, but is not sung during Advent or Lent.

At the opening prayer, called the "collect," which is begun with the words, "let us pray," the presider collects all our prayers into one. We answer with an enthusiastic Amen, meaning "so be it" or "this is true" or "I agree" or "may it be so."

After this, the assembly is seated for the Word of God.

What Is a Cash Card?

Cash Card is a term that means "substitute money". When you purchase Cash Cards, you're purchasing negotiable gift certificates and prepaid cards that are used just like cash. You can use Cash Cards to purchase everyday expenses like food, clothing, and other essentials, and with every purchase, you earn revenue for Notre Dame Catholic School.

How Cash Cards generate revenue for you

The Great Lakes Scrip Center acts on behalf of churches, schools and other non-profit organizations to purchase large amounts of Cash Cards from grocery stores, department stores, and other retailers. Because the Cash Card is purchased with cash up front, the participating retailers offer a substantial discount. Notre Dame School buys the Cash Card from Great Lakes Scrip Center at a discount, and re-sells the certificates to families like yours for full face value. The discount - from two to fifteen percent or more - is Notre Dame Catholic School's revenue.

Cash Cards is "shopping cart fundraising"

Cash Card is a popular fundraiser because families don't have to sell anything. NDS supporters produce revenue by making regular household purchases they would make anyway. Groceries, clothing, toys, gifts, even gasoline can be purchased with cash cards.

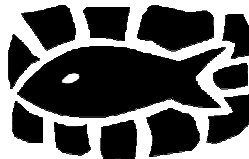
