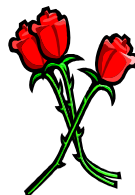

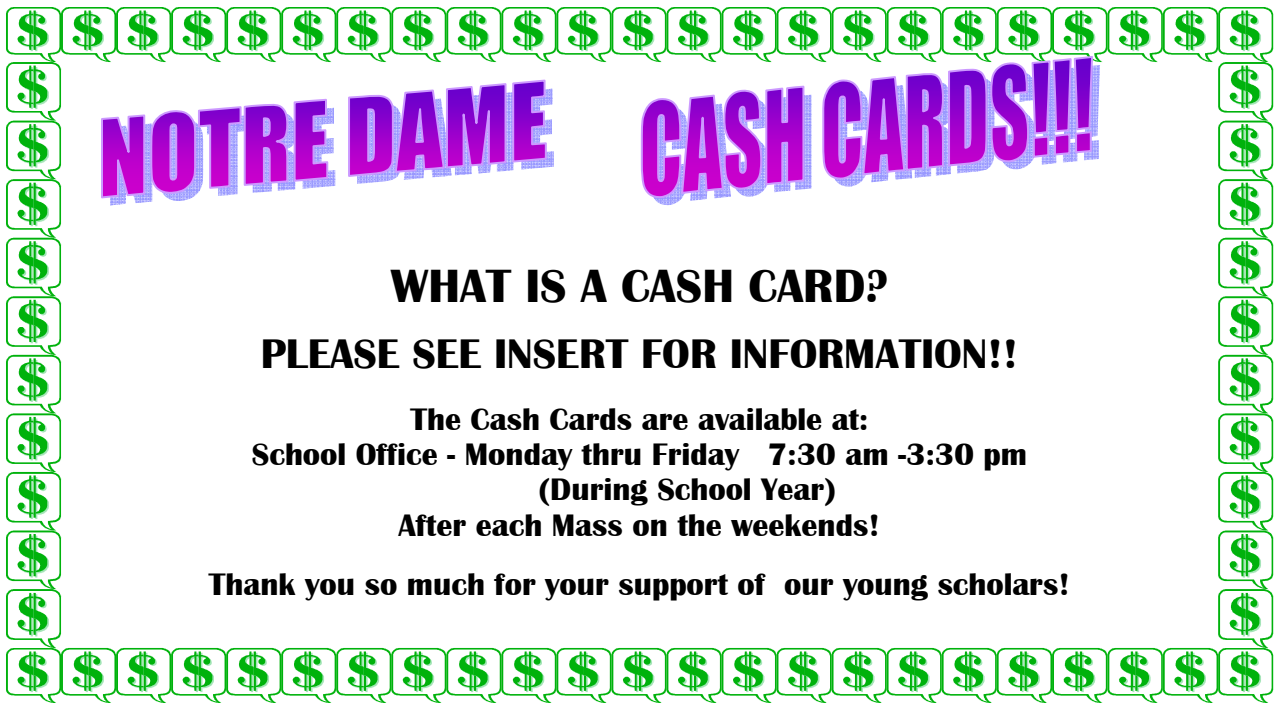

Scrutiny by Paul Turner

Tell people they will face a scrutiny before they can join your community, and they will probably say, "Thanks, but no thanks." Boldly, our church expects not one but three scrutinies of the elect before their baptism at Easter.

Scrutinies are rites of self-searching and repentance. When people from another spiritual background seek baptism in the Catholic church, they do so by stages. First we accept them into the order of catechumens. Then as they complete their catechetical formation we enroll them among the "elect," or those chosen for baptism. This rite of election generally coincides with the beginning of Lent. Three times during Lent the church prays the scrutinies to encourage a spirit of repentance among those who seek a worthy celebration of baptism.

Although scrutinies have returned fairly recently to Catholic parishes, they originated early in church history. St. Ambrose and St. Augustine celebrated them in the fourth and fifth century to mark the spiritual progress of the catechumens. The moral preparation of catechumens included prayers of exorcism to drive out the spirit of evil which kept them from embracing Christ as their light. In the scrutinies the church discerned if those exorcisms had achieved their effect. Catechumens entered the church, stood barefoot on goatskin and renounced evil influences all night. Those unworthy of baptism had to wait another year for Easter to roll around again.

Today's scrutinies seem less intense. They still include an exorcism, in which the priest or deacon prays that the spirit of evil may be replaced by the spirit of good. Their purpose is not so much to examine the candidates' mental readiness but their spiritual readiness. Scrutinies offer the catechumens the support they need to approach the waters of baptism worthily.

For those who are already baptized, the scrutinies invite us to embrace the same spirit of self-searching and repentance. At Easter we renew our baptismal promises as we see the catechumens baptized. So during Lent we renew our repentance as we see the elect scrutinized. The scrutinies remind us of the seriousness of our Christian life and inspire us to turn from evil and pursue good. LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

For the past two weeks, we have taken a look at the Introductory Rites of the Mass and the Liturgy of the Word. Today, we will focus on the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

From the earliest days of the Church, there have been collections of money during the liturgy. It is one way we can make a return to God for all that He has done for us. As time went on, people brought all the things needed for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass – bread and wine for communion, money for the upkeep of the church, food for the poor, and support for the ministries, and food, animals, and a share of their crops as symbols of their labors. Today, it is much more practical to limit our gifts to bread, wine and money. As the gifts are brought forward and prepared, we too prepare ourselves to receive Jesus. The priest prepares the bread and wine which we will later receive.

In the early days, the priest washed his hands after handling all the various foods and animals. Today, he prays to be cleansed from his sins. After washing, he comes to the center of the altar and we stand as he invites us to pray that our gifts may be accepted by God so that the bread and wine will be truly changed into the Body and Blood of Christ.

We have made the preparations for the Liturgy of the Eucharist, and now we stand and enter into the Eucharistic Prayer which begins with the Preface Dialog – the dialog between the priest and assembly. At the preface, the priest recalls for us many of God's gifts and blessings, for which we give thanks and praise. It leads us to join the angels and saints in a song of praise – the Holy, Holy, Holy.

As we kneel, the priest then continues the Eucharistic Prayer – the great prayer of thanksgiving of the whole assembly prayed by him for us in our name.

We hear the priest call upon the Holy Spirit. In the words of institution, we hear the very words used by Jesus at the Last Supper: "This is my body; this is my blood." The bread and wine we offered at the Presentation of the Gifts is truly the Body and Blood of Jesus.

After the elevation of the Body and Blood of Jesus, the priest invites us to "proclaim the mystery of faith", and we respond with the Memorial Acclamation, one of the responses being "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again." The Paschal Mystery – the dying and rising of Jesus – is our mystery as well. Our dying and rising many times in every day living are joined to His.

As the Eucharistic Prayer continues, we pray for the Church, church leaders, world leaders, the living and the dead. We honor Mary and all the saints, and ask to be numbered among the saints when we die. We ask for forgiveness, and conclude our prayer through the Trinity with a resounding AMEN.

The Communion Rites begin with the Our Father as we prepare to receive Holy Communion. Then, we are asked to share a Sign of Peace, symbolic of asking forgiveness of all whom we may have injured. We do this before we come to the table of the Lord.

The Fraction Rite – the breaking of the bread is essential. Bread cannot be shared unless it is broken. The Body of Christ was broken for us, and we, the Body of Christ, though many, share from the one consecrated bread. This is an expression of our identity as the one Body of Christ. The "Lamb of God" is sung until all bread is broken.

The priest shows us the sacred species and uses the words of John the Baptist, who pointed out Jesus to the first disciples as the Lamb of God.

Communion is the culmination of our liturgical worship. Our procession to receive is another sign of unity as we sing the Communion song. As we approach the minister, we bow our heads in reverence to Him whom we will receive, and respond with "Amen" as we are offered the sacred species.

After communion, we reflect upon the great gift that is ours through the generous love of God. We have just shared in a banquet to which all are invited. This is the foretaste of the banquet all will share in heaven.

The Communion Rites end with the Prayer After Communion.

What Is a Cash Card?

Cash Card is a term that means "substitute money". When you purchase Cash Cards, you're purchasing negotiable gift certificates and prepaid cards that are used just like cash. You can use Cash Cards to purchase everyday expenses like food, clothing, and other essentials, and with every purchase, you earn revenue for Notre Dame Catholic School.

How Cash Cards generate revenue for you

The Great Lakes Scrip Center acts on behalf of churches, schools and other non-profit organizations to purchase large amounts of Cash Cards from grocery stores, department stores, and other retailers. Because the Cash Card is purchased with cash up front, the participating retailers offer a substantial discount. Notre Dame School buys the Cash Card from Great Lakes Scrip Center at a discount, and re-sells the certificates to families like yours for full face value. The discount - from two to fifteen percent or more - is Notre Dame Catholic School's revenue.

Cash Cards is "shopping cart fundraising"

Cash Card is a popular fundraiser because families don't have to sell anything. NDS supporters produce revenue by making regular household purchases they would make anyway. Groceries, clothing, toys, gifts, even gasoline can be purchased with cash cards.
