GIVING ALL

Trusting widows play a significant role in this weekend's readings. At the point of poverty, when giving even the smallest amount of what they had could imperil their health and well-being, they trusted God and gave anyway. What is important about their giving is not what or how much they gave, but how they gave it. Without selfishness, they gave to help others. Their giving was from the heart, with little hope or intention of receiving any sort of reward or recognition for their generosity. The monetary values of the widows' gifts were small, but their value measured in the Kingdom was priceless.

There is a significant similarity between their gift and the gift Jesus gave each of us. The widows offered their lives for God. Jesus offered his life for us.

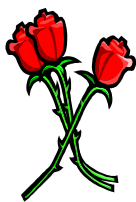

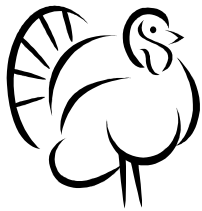

Notre Dame Catholic Church's Family Giving Tree

Again, this year, our parish will undertake a ministry to the poor in the form of the Family Giving Tree. Seventy-five families will be identified from those served by the St. Vincent de Paul Society for inclusion on this tree. These families will be represented on the Jesse Tree in the Narthex by a numbered ornament which will show the size and composition (i.e. number of children) of the receiving family so that the Parish Giving (Adopting) Family will have sufficient information to make a selection.

The adopting (giving) family, upon selecting an ornament from the tree, will take on the responsibility of providing a positive Christmas experience to the less fortunate family. This will be accomplished by first, obtaining the family's information from the Pastoral Center and, if desired, meeting with the needy family in order to more accurately determine their needs, pur-
chasing gifts for each child, age 12 and under, of the receiving family, perhaps assisting with food for their Christmas dinner and directly delivering the gifts to the receiving family, or St. Vincent de Paul Society will see to it that your gifts are received by the family for whom they are intended. The adopting family will retain the ornament from the tree to remind them of their commitment and to serve as a memento of their Advent journey and experience. To help defray the expense, several families may choose to go together in providing for a larger needy family.

The Family Giving Tree will be decorated and the ornaments available for selection at the weekend Masses on **December 2nd and 3rd** which coincides with the First Weekend of Advent. Following selection of an ornament, the adopting family is expected to contact the Pastoral Center office in order to obtain the specific information (names, address, and telephone number and gift ideas) for the receiving family's children.

Please give your prayerful consideration to participating in this Ministry to the Poor. Remember that "whatsoever you do for the least of my children that you do unto me".

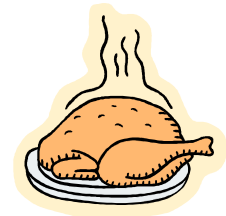
