This moment in Kerr County time....

"In (Kerrville) the 1910 census, taken before Fr. Kemper's arrival in the community, the population of Kerrville stood at 1,843. Predominantly a rural, agricultural area, most of Kerr County's 5,505 residents lived on ranches and in the smaller villages of the county. Over the course of Fr. Kemper's ministry in Kerrville, the population grew steadily to 4, 546 in 1930 and approximately 8,000 by the time of his retirement in 1955. During that time innovations had changed American society and affected Kerr County. When the parish was organized, most parishioners still used horses and buggies to travel to church or to any place of reasonable distance. Father Kemper himself used such means of transportation on his travels to outlying stations such as Turtle Creek or Japonica (today's Hunt). There was neither electricity in the homes or churches nor air conditioning to cool worshipers on hot summer Sundays. By the end of Father Kemper's pastorate, the automobile age had revolutionized life. ... Electricity lit homes, schools, and churches and electric or gas heating systems kept them warm in the winter (although many Kerrville residents and businesses continued to believe an open window and a Hill Country breeze provided the best system of cooling). *Legacy of Faith, R.A. OCTOBER-Month of the Rosary



October is recognized as the Month of the Rosary. A popular legend tells us that the Rosary, or “garland of roses” was given to St. Dominic by the Blessed Mother when she appeared to him. Historians believe that the Rosary evolved from religious traditions practiced between the 12th and 15th centuries. In those early days of the church, monks were known to recite 150 psalms of David in repetitious prayer. Lay people adopted the monks’ practice by saying 150 repetitions of the Our Father. To keep count, they would carry strings of knots or beads. What eventually evolved was the Rosary as we know it today.

STEWARDSHIP – *A Way of Life*

One definition states that a **STEWARD** is a person who manages the affairs of a household or an estate for the owner. 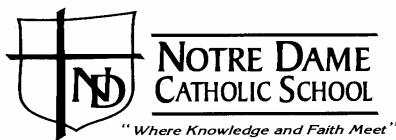

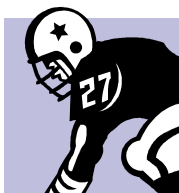
